Our Association was established formally on May 7, 1939, and while we celebrated our Golden Anniversary of the Association in 1989, it should be noted that two Reunions were cancelled during WWII, hence our Golden Reunion this July. We cordially invite you and yours to come be a part of this historic Reunion.

Great things are planned for this Golden Reunion Anniversary. Among other things, the following activities are planned: exciting "Hunt" will again take place. was done for the 1st time at the '90 Reunion and was very well received. In a nutshell, we divided into small groups and armed with a sheet of statements, we had to find the correct historical site, read and find the missing information to fill-in the sheet, and accomplish all this on a time basis. DIRECTIONS TO CAMP LONE STAR

For the benefit of our first-time attenders, learn that immediately south of La Grange, on Hwy. #77 south to Victoria, is a bridge spanning the Colorado River. About 150 yards from the southern end of the bridge is a sign saying "CAMP LONE STAR". Turn east on that road and go 2 miles to the Camp, simply following the signs; 1/2 mile is paved, the other 1-1/2 is dirt but usually in good condition. Clothe yourselves in your charming personality, fortitude, and vigor and come be with us.

COST

The cost at Camp Lone Star is reasonable and compares favorably with any other manner of financing your Reunion expenses. The cost is prorated and is determined by your arrival time. If you spend the full 2-1/2 days there, you'll have 5 full meals (all you can eat), 2 nights lodging, plus full use of all facilities for around \$63.00 per adult and \$40.00 per child. However, the maximum charge per family will not exceed \$180.00 for all 2-1/2 days. Age 5 and under--no charge! If you arrive Sat. or Sun., your charge will be prorated from the above figures. ROOMS

Being a 1st class retreat, the rooms sleep either 4 or 6. You'll want to choose some room-mates and fill these rooms up because the more in each room, the lesser the charge per head in the room. The rooms are air-conditioned and very nice. Linen, blankets, and pillows are furnished. Bring no food!



Kelly Brewer married Howard Roitenberg in October, 1990, and they are now residing at 11815 Chessington, Houston, TX 77031. II-87.



THE 1990 REUNION REVISITED

The 1990 Reunion was held at Camp Lone Star, La Grange, Texas, on July 21, 1990. President Darlyn Bechtol opened the meeting at 4:02 p.m., we pledged allegiance, were welcomed formally by the President, and held self-introductions. There were 91 present. We dispensed with reading of the minutes and Robert Hein gave his Treasurer's report.

Historian Dale U. von Rosenberg read a newspaper article published in the La Grange newspaper concerning our 50th Reunion, which was quite informative. He also talked about Mrs. Inga Schmidt of Germany and her relationship to our Family.

Edna von Rosenberg of Cameron moved we form a Family Cookbook for distribution to Family members. Full details are covered in the June, 1990, Newsletter. President Darlyn told about our "T" shirt sales for the 50th Anniversary. She said 242 were sold, all at cost.

The members present voted the 1991 Golden Reunion back to Camp Lone Star July 19, 20, 21. The Secretary gave a report on the Family mailing list, that around 600 names were still unaccounted for, and Eberhard Besemann read the death notice of Kuno Meerscheidt of Germany. He came from the Froelich branch and visited our Reunion some years ago. Ted von Rosenberg of San Antonio then gave a heart-warming and detailed speech about his and Howard Hughes' plane crash. They were indeed fortunate that they didn't drown. President Darlyn then gave full details and rules concerning the "Hunt" which was to commence when this meeting was adjourned. The meeting adjourned at 5:40 p.m.

SUNDAY MEETING

The Sunday meeting was held July 22, 1990, at Camp Lone Star in La Grange, Texas. President Darlyn Bechtol of Austin called the meeting to order at 11:08 a.m. Leo Meerscheidt IV, of Sacramento, Cal., traveled the greatest distance to attend; the oldest was Ted von Rosenberg of San Antonio; and Kasey Green, son of Daryl and Rhonda Green of Charlotte, NC, was the youngest in attendance.

A motion was made and seconded that we do away with the Sunday morning meeting at our Reunions in the future. This motion passed. Edna von Rosenberg and Sheri will hold a short devotional at 11:30 a.m. on Sunday next year. It was suggested that we list and count branch numbers of each member when they register at the Reunion. This was also adopted. Roger von Rosenberg moved that the "Hunt" be repeated again next year. This was passed and, strangely enough, Roger will be the Chairman. The meeting adjourned at 11:37 a.m.
